Aim of Course: This conference aims to celebrate and raise awareness of successful strategies to increase participation in learning and provide details of the new statutory requirements for Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance.

Description: From 2015, all young people will stay on in education, training or employment with training until their eighteenth birthday. In East Sussex, we are already working well in partnership to increase participation in learning, reduce the number of those not in education, employment or training (NEETs), and to prepare for full participation.

At the conference we will hear from national experts on curriculum development, engagement and transition and have the opportunity to share good practice developed locally. We will also hear from local young people about their experiences and what has helped them re-engage in education.

The conference will cover the following topics: tackling disengagement within schools and colleges, successful transition to post-16 education, curriculum development to support participation and progression, and Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance in the new world (CE IAG).

Outcomes: By the end of the course, it is anticipated that you will:-

- know about the latest policy developments and successful methods to increase participation;
- understand the experiences of young people and the implications of the

- new statutory requirements in relation to CE IAG;
- be able to take back successful strategies to apply in your own institution and develop partnership working with new partners.
