4. SCTP Activity Update - Paul Mitchell, SCTP Co-Executive Director

Paul updated the members on the following activity, further details can be found in his presentation:

Lobbying & Representation. An update was given on who SCTP has been working with on members' behalf and the strategic groups we have been part of. The newsletter will outline each week what meetings SCTP are attending, so please do let us know what your issues are so we can represent your views at these meetings



- SCTP Personnel Changes. Following the departure of Co-Executive Director, Ann Potterton, there will be a temporary plan in place 1 October 31 January. Paul will cover pan-Sussex strategic meetings, membership recruitment and strategy. Sarah Sawyer will cover project management, CPD, SCTP & AIS websites and social media. The new structure will be finalised at the Board meeting on 13 November.
- o SCTP CPD Programme. All the times, dates and venues for the CPD programme are available on the website (and in the presentation). Courses offered are Introduction to Curriculum Planning by AELP, End Point Assessment by NCFE, Maths and English Observation training, Matrix Introduction & Reassessment, Business Development training (post levy implications), Health & Safety training (post levy implications). The first two are available to book now by emailing sarahsawyer@sctp.org.uk. The Introduction to Curriculum Planning session is eligible for the AELP bursary for small independent training providers.
- o **CPD Procurement Policy**. A new policy has been produced regarding procuring training for SCTP CPD events and is available on the SCTP website.
- o **NCOP Project.** Further details about this project and its reach and objectives were outlined.
- Strategic Leaders Forum. This meeting is now open to all full members and is an opportunity for senior leaders to share experiences & best practice. The last meeting was held on 13 September and the next meeting will be on 30 January at Sussex Cricket Ground, Hove.
- o **Pre-Employment Group**. The next meeting of this group is 11 October 09:30 12:30 at Sussex Downs College in Newhaven. Booking will be open very soon.
- o **SCTP Membership.** There are currently 116 SCTP members. Renewal is due on 1 November. Full membership has been held at £450, commercial associate is £400 and partner associate is £300. Paul encouraged all members to renew their membership to ensure that SCTP remains a strong network supporting its members.
- SCTP Website. The new SCTP website will be ready to be launched next week. There is a member only area which will host the SCTP news page and resources. - Events. There are a few events planned which will be of interest to some members. Further details about all three will be circulated shortly:
 - o Brighton & Hove City Council are holding an apprenticeship event aimed at school business managers, head teachers and governors on 7 November at Hove Town Hall. Any providers who offer apprenticeships which would be relevant to schools are asked to express an interest. Providers do not need to use the DPS system to work with Brighton & Hove City Council, so this opportunity would be open to all providers with relevant provision.
 - Brighton & Hove City Council are planning to run a graduation ceremony during National Apprenticeship Week (March 2018). Any apprentices who either live, work or study in Brighton & Hove and who graduate between September 2017 – April 2018 will be eligible.
 - South Coast Careers Network are holding an event on 3 November in Bognor aimed at learners.

5. SCTP Member Survey Results

The member survey was open between May and September and saw 63% of members give their views. 72% were very satisfied with the service provided by SCTP and 28% were satisfied. The survey also highlighted views of the most and least useful activities and how SCTP could be of benefit over the next two years. Please see the <u>survey presentation</u> for more details.

6. Member Discussion & Information Exchange

Members were asked to discuss the issues which are important to them right now. The subjects discussed were:

- Lack of understanding amongst employers about the Apprenticeship Levy and how important it is for training providers to help them with this. Also, issues were reported arising from conflicts between required ESFA employer contracts and the employers' own contracting requirements.
- 20% off the job training rules were vague causing mixed interpretations which might only be resolved too late via external inspection.
- Some Apprenticeship standards not being ready for delivery making it difficult for providers to respond to employer demand. Aligned to this is the issue of badly written and vague assessment plans for some standards as well as the free market leading to a 'race to the bottom' as providers compete on price.
- Dynamic Purchasing Systems (DPS) being time consuming and bureaucratic with employers having their own procurement systems and the myriad of mini-tenders which providers need to spend time and resources on.
- o IAG concerns for year 11 students. It can be hard for providers to gain access to Year 11 students, especially those at schools with sixth forms, typically leaving smaller providers with less opportunities to reach these potential learners.
- Uncertainty of non-levy funding with the results of the tender round due in December with providers to start delivery on 1 January.
- Request for more information about the positive impact of the AIS website and events service and more information about which employers are levy payers.

7. DWP Update from Steve Benwell, Relationship Manager, DWP

Steve Benwell from DWP updated the members on the new Universal Credit Service, the Work & Health Programme and the DPS system that they are using. Steve covered what the new Universal credit service will mean for claimants, how it will work and its proposed benefits. The Work and Health Programme runs from January 2018 until November 2022 and is linked to helping disabled people and long term unemployed back into work. Referrals can be made to the DWP by external



organisations. Steve gave an update on the Dynamic Purchasing System, their digital procurement system. Their priorities going forward will be provision for the long term unemployed, those over 50, lone parents and ex-offenders. For further details, please see Steve's DWP presentation. 8. Apprenticeships: A BT Perspective – Bob Soper-Dyer, Head of Apprenticeships, BT
Bob talked to members about what it is like to be a levy paying employer. He spoke to members about employers not being able to sustain using the levy just for new recruits, they will need providers to advise them on upskilling of existing employees, how to diversify and use apprenticeships in areas of their business not previously explored. He also talked about the costs employers face, such as management and admin costs, which need to be considered within the funding band when providers discuss costs with employers. Bob also outlined some of the activities that employers are using to meet the 20% off the job training. Further details can be seen in Bob's BT apprenticeships presentation.

9. ESFA Update - Chris Shaw, Provider Manager, ESFA

Chris covered the following areas in his <u>presentation:</u>

- Advanced Learner Loans new processes are in place, including changes to performance management points.
- Non-Levy allocations variations in non-levy growth PMP1 should be out in the next week or so. Members fed back that it is difficult to plan business or talk to employers when they are receiving contracts one month before delivery. Chris said he would feedback these views.
- o AEB 17/18 contracts should be issued on the SFS in the next couple of weeks. He assured members that the tendering process was designed to be a fair and transparent process.
- Change in caseload provider managers will be visiting new providers for assurance visits as a priority and hope to visit all providers on their caseload by early 2018.
- When asked about the re-opening of the Register of Training Organisations and the Register of Apprenticeship Training Providers (RoATP), Chris did not have a firm date. Colleagues at AELP are quoting a DfE source that says the RoATP will re-open on 25 September (see Latest News page on SCTP website).
