The Work and Health Programme



Requirements:

- Achieve sustained employment outcomes
- Provide participants with more tailored support
- Have strong links with employers national and local
- Integrate with health, social care, and other local provision
- Take a holistic approach to tackling barriers to employment

Critical Success Factors:

- Help disabled people, the long term unemployed and other specified disadvantaged groups to find and sustain work as measured by earnings received (or duration of self-employment for the selfemployed)
- Integrate the WHP with local services and local health provision so that WHP participants can receive co-ordinated, holistic support.
- Support the principle of localism by ensuring that the WHP meets local priorities in the Devolution Deal Areas and the national Programme better reflects local needs

Start: **15**th Jan **2017**

Programme Duration: 5 years + 2

Time on Programme: 15 months (+6months)

Outcomes based on earnings: £2,995 (£3120 from April 2018)

Flexible job hours – not limited to 16hrs / week

Performance: Blended average **50.13%** reaching the earning level



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

Participant Journey




