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## Invitation to apply to deliver T levels in the 2020-2021 Academic Year

When we published the T levels Action Plan in October 2017, we gave you more detail about plans to introduce reforms to technical education, and about T levels in particular. As part of the Action Plan, we announced that some T level pathways would be delivered in 2020. These are: the Software Applications Design and Development pathway; the Building Services Engineering pathway; and the Education pathway.

I'm very pleased to be writing to you now to invite you to apply to be one of the first providers to deliver new T levels from these pathways in the 2020/2021 academic year. We hope these new programmes of technical education will transform the quality of technical education and the future prospects of many students and that you feel as enthusiastic as we do about this next step in their delivery.

We want to make sure that the initial introduction of T levels goes well and that we are able to adequately support those providers who deliver first. We are therefore looking for a small group of institutions for the 2020/2021 academic year, and have set out a number of criteria to help us identify who they should be.
