

Skills East Sussex

Priorities

- 1. Improving the quality and relevance of Careers Education Information Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) for people of all ages
- 2. Helping young people become ready for the world of employment
- 3. Addressing gender imbalance in employment/study in key industries
- 4. Making sure that the curriculum is shaped by employers wherever there is scope for this to be done
- 5. Helping to stimulate the uptake of Apprenticeships and higher level skills and learning

Apprenticeships East Sussex

- Agree priorities and set the direction of apprenticeship strategy in East Sussex
- Represent three pillars of apprenticeships apprentices, employers and training providers – and undertake to ensure that each have their needs met within the system
- Horizon scan and identify change, challenge and issues arising, and where appropriate to lobby
- Provide oversight and enable the coordination of key stakeholders, strategies and communication plans
- Ensure alignment with key sectors and ambitions of Skills East Sussex and the county's 16-19 Strategy



Participation: Local Authority statutory duties

- Promote participation in education or training of all 16 and 17 year olds and identify young people who are NEET
- Secure sufficient suitable education and training provision for all aged 16-19, and up to age 25 with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- Provide support to all young people aged 13-19 and to those up to age 25 with an EHCP, to enable participation in education or training
- Tracking young people's participation is a key element of these duties.



16-19 Strategy: all young people learning and working

1. Education and skills that meet the needs of the labour market

- Promote STEM, Apprenticeships/Traineeships, improve English/Maths attainment
- Link to Skills East Sussex priorities, sector task groups and LMI reports

2. Career management

- Support for schools CEIAG network, CPD for careers staff, Quality in Careers Standard, Enterprise Adviser Network, Industry Champions, Open Doors events, UCAS Progress, tracking destinations, C360 website
- Implementation of DfE Careers Strategy (2017) and statutory guidance (Jan 2018)

3. Support for vulnerable learners

- Targeted support for children in or leaving care, young offenders, young parents, SEND, NEET, at risk of NEET
- Commission My Trust to deliver Youth Employability Service

4. Improving work readiness

- Support partners to develop programmes National Citizenship Service, Employability Passport, pre-employment programmes

- 1:1 support for 16s and 17s who are NEET and at risk of NEET
- Transition support for year 11s at risk of NEET
- Specialist advisors children in care/ leaving care, young offenders, drugs
 & alcohol
- Support to those who want to apply for apprenticeships
- Other activities: sub-contractor for STUK Enhancing Apprenticeships,
 Trust Careers IAG provision for schools/training providers
