Results of Ofqual's Functional Skills policy consultation and have your say about the proposed rules and guidance

Ofqual carried out a Functional Skills Qualifications (FSQs) Policy Consultation, which ran from September – November 2017. Ofqual has now considered the responses received and published the decisions taken which can be seen here.

Following the successful first phase of the Maths-4-Life professional development programme last year, which was designed to improve GCSE student re-sit pass rates in Mathematics, we would like to draw your attention to the following **CPD opportunity**.

The first phase of the project produced an evidence-based programme which has been co-developed by the Centre for Research in Mathematics Education at the University of Nottingham and twenty lead practitioners from Further Education Colleges around England.

The project is now looking for teachers of GCSE Mathematics re-sits in colleges (and schools) in England to take part in a two-year randomised controlled trial of the programme.

5. Effective Practice in Assessment and Tracking: an introduction for managers, leaders and practitioners - Eastleigh College 25th April.
