OFSTED Consultation opens on their proposed new framework for inspection

The proposed new OFSTED Framework for Inspection has been launched and they are seeking to consult the Sector. The consultation is open until April 5th so have your say by following this link.

Free phonics CPD available until March 31st

Using coaching strategies to support maths and English

Coaching is a process which aims to unlock a person's potential to maximise their own performance by helping them to learn rather than teaching them." (Whitmore, 2003). This course focuses on how teachers can develop and incorporate coaching approaches into their repertoire of skills, and use these to help maths & English learners become more independent, resilient and resourceful. It will encourage teachers to think differently about their practice and the learning culture in their classroom.
