

What is the job?

Your day will be spent, mostly outside, in all weathers, walking up to 10 miles per day, so please consider this before you apply.

You will be dealing with members of the public face to face, so customer service must be something you enjoy, sometimes in difficult situations.

You must enjoy dealing with people, be friendly polite, and willing to offer support, advice and assistance to colleagues and customers.

PC skills would also be an advantage, as you will be using a handheld device daily. If you can use a mobile phone, you will be able to confidently use the handheld device.
